Briefing Note on the Stance of Alberta's Students' Associations Regarding Mandatory Non-Instructional Fees

What are mandatory non-instructional fees?

Mandatory non-instructional fees are any fees a post-secondary institution levies on students which are not directly related to tuition or learning resources, from which students are unable to opt-out. An example of a mandatory non-instructional fee would be a building construction fee that students must pay, but which does not cover costs that are directly related to instruction (such as faculty salaries, research materials, library resources, etc.).

These fees have been proposed and/or passed at a number of colleges and universities in the province. One example is the Student Services fee at the University of Calgary, which is a \$300 mandatory fee on top of regular tuition costs (Anderson, 2012).

While non-instructional fees are often necessary in order to fund the university, many of Alberta's student associations are critical of the fact that the fees are currently unregulated, seeing them as little more than tuition in disguise. According to the Canadian University Press, these fees are seen by many a loophole for schools to get around the fact that tuition cannot be raised beyond CPI (i.e., the Consumer Price Index; the rate of inflation) without special approval from the Ministry of Advanced Education and Technology (Eldridge, 2010).

What are the province's student associations saying?

Council of Alberta University Students (CAUS)

CAUS represents the undergraduate students' unions at the University of Alberta, the University of Calgary, and the University of Lethbridge. CAUS has developed a policy regarding mandatory non-instructional fees that they have lobbied on for the past two years. The policy can be found on their website at: http://www.caus.net/docs/P-MandatoryFees.pdf.

In brief, the policy states that the Government of Alberta should regulate mandatory non-instructional fees such that all new mandatory non-instructional fees, as well as increases to such fees that already exist, should be capped at CPI. Under the policy that CAUS proposes, any increase in mandatory non-instructional fees beyond CPI would require a student referendum.

Alberta Students' Executive Council (ASEC)

ASEC represents students studying at colleges, polytechnic institutions, and some universities. Their membership includes, among others, students' associations from NAIT, MacEwan University, SAIT, Red

Deer College, and Mount Royal University. This year, the Athabasca University Students' Union (AUSU) joined ASEC as a prospective member.

ASEC's stance is essentially the same as that of CAUS, but it is somewhat stricter, in that they would like to see "regulations for all non-academic and ancillary fees [embedded] into the *Tuition Fee Regulation*" (ASEC, 2011). This would mean that increases to mandatory non-academic fees would be capped at CPI in the same way that tuition increases are. The difference between the ASEC policy and the CAUS policy is that ASEC's policy, as written, would not allow for increases beyond CPI to be put to a student referendum—they simply could not happen.

Alberta Graduate Council (AGC)

AGC represents the graduate students studying at Alberta's four research-intensive universities: Athabasca University, and the Universities of Alberta, Calgary, and Lethbridge.
