6.1-Advocacy Update	 President Cynthia met with AbGPAC developed a five year strategic plan. Four areas: Relationships; reputation; operational and advocacy. Quality measure: data about different programs that are available, how they compare, Labor relations: looking for input regarding the right to strike. Previously not covered under labor code. Presented a document to Government and we had three seats at the table. Binding arbitration is also necessary to prevent lock-out. Final legislation will be coming out this spring.
